#### **HOA UPDATE:** 1ST BOARD MEETING

On Thursday, October 28th, we held our first board meeting to go over transitionary items. That included reviewing current contracts, presenting new ideas for communications, electing officers, and setting priorities.

One of the outstanding issues we needed to resolve was the contract with Associa, our management company. The contract was due on October 30th, which did not provide us with much time. While Kiahna Davis was able to secure a oneweek extension, we determined there was unfortunately not enough time to interview other management companies and transfer our accounts from Associa if that was the direction we wanted to go. Therefore, moving forward, we've agreed to redirect our representative, Olga Hunt, to spend more time on procuring vendors and bids for the common area. We also plan to move violation "checks" to once per quarter, versus two times per month. One or more board members will always attend these, which will include common area evaluations. If a resident receives a violation, it will include a photo so communications will be made more clear. And speaking of communications, as mentioned, we are working on a website that will be easily accessible, and one more way to keep our neighborhood informed.

in Sunday, July 3rd as our tentative




